Uphold ASEAN's centrality to remain relevant: His Majesty

Accompanying His Majesty was His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Mateen.

His Majesty believed that ASEAN needs to do more in promoting and implementing the ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific, which would ensure it also remains a platform for dialogue and cooperation towards continued progress, peace and prosperity.

On the situation in Myanmar, the resolution of the problems in the country is in the hands of its people, through a Myanmar-led and Myanmar-owned process. Therefore, ASEAN should continue to facilitate a conducive environment for their reconciliation.

In concluding the titah, His Majesty proposed that ASEAN should consider engaging Myanmar once again in the near future, to emphasise concerns on the implementation of the Five-Point Consensus, which ASEAN leaders had agreed upon in 2021.
